State Legislature Report – Brian King , Representative, District 28

- Legislative agenda for new session
  - Clean air (15 bills in works) - Need higher standards than EPA and particulate controls
  - Same sex marriage - Not much state can do; this is a constitutional issue
  - Liquor laws - Make decision based on relevance to public health and public safety
    - Zion's Curtain law will pass House
  - Public and Higher Education - Most important budget issue
- Q&A
  - Clean air bill for reduced transit fares in worst inversion months; to increase funding raise gas tax.
  - Bipartisan clean air caucus based on positive polls and concerns of potential new businesses from outside
  - Public welcome to come sit with Brian during legislature in session; contact by email or phone to arrange

Salt Lake City Council Report – Erin Mendenhall, Representative, District 5

- Horse carriages public hearings – more public comments that recent issues
  - Wood burning ban - Decided to broaden scope to be effective
  - DAQ enforcement is not good; 167 sole source homes
- Zoning change approved for 700 South to 900 South and 700 East TO 900 East

Snow Removal – Parviz Rokhva, Director, Streets and Sanitation Division, SLC

- Patterns
  - Main Arterials first 1300 S and 1700 S
  - N and S secondary arteries
  - Residential streets
- GPS tracker system shows where snow plows are/have been
- Try to do within a reasonable time; snow storm intensity requires going back to main arterials
- Q&A
  - Road repairs-7 year rotation; variables-rain, vehicle malfunction
  - There is no snow removal ordinance that requires moving cars off the street; Open City Hall feedback: law is not needed. Nevertheless, moving cars is encouraged.

Wasatch Hollow Open Space Development – Emy Maloutas, Open Space Lands Program Manager, SLC

- Recap of WHOS history
  - Start 2008, acquired central meadow and northern meadow
  - Received funding to do a plan, completed in 2010-2011, available online
  - Have funding for design and build \$550K; finalizing contract
- Doing comprehensive open space signage project ca. \$300K
- Miller Park restoration project about to start
- Q&A
  - Parks department has snow removal priority list; will convey concern about WH park walkways
  - Putting together volunteer project calendars
  - May be possible to add Wasatch Hollow oral history to open space signage project
