- Summary of positions - city operated bus service, promotes solar energy, increase accessibility of city government
- Q&A
  - SLCPD – Communication skills. Advocates neighborhood foot and bicycle patrols.
  - Affordable housing in neighborhoods.
  - 11<sup>th</sup> east streetcar – streetcar good if want to develop an area; problematic for residential area.

Charlie Luke & Tracey Harty - Candidates for Salt Lake City Council, District 6

- Q & A moderated by Michael Dodd
  - Charlie Luke. Served 4 years. District developments at 13<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, 21 E and 13 S, and 21<sup>st</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, Research Park, Foothill cultural district. Things that need work – public safety, capital improvement projects, economic development to offset taxpayer burden due to tax exemption on 42% of property.
  - Tracey Harty. Lives in Yalecrest. Active in community council. Ran for city council 4 years ago. Experience in public relations and marketing. Past president of Women's

Transportation Seminar's Utah chapter. Positions: need more representation for women in leadership, opposed to giant rebuilds, supports KEEP Yalecrest – character conservation and preservation. Vision: safe, healthy, and vibrant neighborhood.

- Questions from WHCC members:
  - C. 42% tax exemption for churches, city and state government, non-profits
  - C. Economic directors have quit because they did not enough freedom of action or resources
  - T. Economic development: need to involve public in small area plans for our District to attract businesses
  - T. City operated transit system – funding is a big issue.
  - C. Totally for exploring city based transit system. Use bond to control funding. Contract out operation.
  - Is pace of development responsible in view of the water situation?
    - T. need to know whether we are using water more efficiently
    - C. planning is the key. Water conservation – parks shifting from culinary to secondary water; Bonneville golf course upgraded irrigation system.
  - Mayoral candidates
    - C. Will support whoever wins.
    - T. Ditto
  - Golf courses and public support for open space
    - T. Hard to shut down a golf course but like the idea of adding more running trails. District 6 try to maintain what we have.
    - C. Bonneville and Mountain Dell make money. But all courses are falling apart due to deferred maintenance.
  - Close
    - T. In learning mode. Look forward to dialoging and learning more about voters' issues.
    - C. Have enjoyed working on neighborhood issues. Engaging with community members has been rewarding. Have been able to do a lot; there is more that we can do.
