- Capital Improvement Project budget discussion concluded. Evaluations of proposals will put citizen priorities ahead of council priorities.
 - 1700 South project took years to get approved with citizen involvement; recommend start petition now if want a project done.
- Off-leash dogs discussion starts October 17th. Will take up recommendations of off-leash dog committee.
- Impact fees. Requirements difficult to work through. Money sits and has to be paid back to developers if not used in 6 years. Council to figure out how to use money. Mayor Becker is proposing a one year moratorium while this is worked out
