Summary
Reid Johnson offers brief recollections about Sugarhouse Prison, occupation of the family home on Harrison, barbers in the area, cost of tuition at the University of Utah in 1950, quality of life in the neighborhood, and walking through alleys to church.

00:00:00	Sugarhouse Prison. Recalls high wall.
00:00:53	Paused while Reid looked through his notes.
00:01:13	Family home on Harrison. Talks about years he lived in the family home, 1937-1953. Age 9. Parents stayed until 1974-75. Bought by eldest daughter it in 1975.
00:04:18	Stores on 17th and 17th. Only patronized a barber there until marriage in 1953.
00:05:41	Earning tuition for University of Utah. Tells about getting a construction job to earn \$60 in one week which paid his tuition in 1950.
00:08:12	Swearing barber. Tells about ceasing to patronize a young barber at 15 th and 15 th because of foul language.
00:09:14	Comment on the neighborhood. Loved it. Family homes, good families.
00:10:10	Alley. Used to walk to walk through an alley from Harrison to Wasatch Ward on Emerson.
00:11:36	End time
