6:30 Treasurer, John Rosswog called the meeting to order

6:35 Lieutenant Andy Leonard, Salt Lake City Police Department report

• A bomb threat shut down The King's English book store for a full day on 9/24. The threat, from an untraceable account, probably originated from a hate-generating "bot" program as a way to terrorize the proprietors for hosting a Children's Story Time with a drag queen. The same account has been used to send similar threats to various locations around the country. The SLPD Canine Unit searched the store and environs. The in-depth search "gave zero indications" of any type of explosive, and the threat was considered insignificant. Though the SLPD SWAT team and the FBI were notified, neither force was called out due to the unsubstantiated threat. 6:50 Hannah Barton, Mayor's Office Liaison report

- With help from Utah State, SLC's new pilot program to house the homeless will consist of 25 temporary structures, each with two one-person domiciles. The structures are temporary and mobile, and they fold flat for storage when not needed. The program requires shutting down or relocating the units after 180 days. They will be shared by other Utah cities with a temporary housing need. They supplement another 625 beds that come online this winter in addition to the existing facilities statewide.
- Traffic-calming construction on 1300 South will happen in three sections, each section taking a week to complete substantially. Through traffic on 1300 South should be able to resume by October 16.
- The 2100 South repaving project will also upgrade deep utility lines and a 100-year-old sewer line. The greatest impact of construction will be between 1300 East and 1000 East with only one lane in each direction through October. Beyond that, expect restricted lanes and limited left turns at Highland Drive into 2024.
- SLC has about half of the grade-school population it had in the 1950's, and the SLS District has too many elementary schools. The Salt Lake School Board will hold public meetings to discuss the necessary closures. - Partygoers at the WH Community Party filled out surveys and submitted these suggestions:
 - Dog park cleanup. Limit off-leash areas, or at least delineate designated dog areas
 - o Restore the lawn/soccer field. Add more "non-dog" grass areas for children's play
 - Additional nature restoration in the preserve
 - Repair the gates and add signage to restrict the preserve to pedestrians and not pets
 - Add more children's play equipment
 - Add children's nature activities
 - Return the movies in WH Park
 - Hold monthly music festivals
- In the survey, they expressed these concerns about the WH Neighborhood in general:
 - o Safety and security. Preventing car break-ins
 - Revised street parking plan with regard to traffic calming measures
 - Speed bumps on Sherman Ave
 - o Improving sustainability and recycling efforts
 - At Clayton JHS, parking lot control use the chain barricade when not in use to prevent loitering and reduce using the lot for fireworks
- Attendees at this WHCC meeting had these suggestions for the next WH Community Party:
 - Add a WH Winter Party during the holiday period.
 - Access additional funds from the City to promote community involvement
 - Develop a Party Planning Committee and get volunteers to share the burden of hosting a huge party
 - o Donate to one or more Scout troops in trade for providing a set-up and take-down team
 - Two hours seemed like a good amount of time for having the party
