6:40 Chairperson John Rosswog called the meeting to order

- Minutes from the February meeting approved unanimously.
 - Rezoning discussion postponed; workshops to be scheduled.
 - District 6 Representative Dan Dugan will hold a community meeting on March 26 at the library.

6:45 Legislative Overview – Rep. Hoang Nguyen & Sen. Jen Plumb

- Both speakers are in their first term and serve on multiple committees, including the Water Commission.
 - Key updates from the legislative session:
 - Modest state tax cut (~\$50 annual impact per household) alongside reductions in some public program funding.
 - Continued increases in property taxes at the local level.
 - Ongoing state efforts affecting Salt Lake City authority, including transportation infrastructure.
 - Inland Port development continues, though progress has been slow.
 - Concerns raised about a proposed ICE facility; local control is limited, but mitigation efforts are being explored.
 - Great Salt Lake remains a critical issue, with most water coming from inflow sources.
 - Highlighted successes:
 - Water legislation supporting long-term supply planning.
 - Education and public health initiatives, including student vision services.
 - Residents are encouraged to stay engaged and communicate with elected officials.

- Member of the SLC Bicycling Committee (volunteer advisory group).
 - Committee meets monthly and advises on transportation and bike-related issues.

7:25 Report from Mayor's Office – Hannah Barton

- Overview of Salt Lake City budget (~\$1.9 billion).
 - Major revenue sources: sales tax, property tax, and intergovernmental funding.
 - Significant portion of budget allocated to public safety
 - Current challenges include inflation and potential federal funding reductions.
 - Budget timeline: proposal in May, public hearings in May/June, adoption by June 30.
